Focus: Vietnam Veterans






Demographics: About 1 of 3 Veterans in Florida is a Vietnamera Veteran - more than 476,000; projected tops in nation in 2025.

Challenge: Reluctant to seek help. PACT Act recognizes service may have exposed Veterans to Agent Orange & other herbicides.

Town Hall Meetings: Underway with at least three statewide locations remaining.




